2.	"Excel to Excellence" Science workshop  2 classes of "Excel to Excellence" Science workshop were held. 16 lessons were conducted in total.  The programme content included training on logical thinking, skills building on participating in inter-school competitions, and enhancing knowledge in Science.  Altogether 38 highly motivated learners of Science from S.5 to S.6 attended.  Expenditure: \$4,560	-	it is recommended to re-run this workshop again in the coming school year.  The overall percentage of attendance among students was not satisfactory with only around 65% each. Students' attendance was severely affected by time clashes with other enhancement courses, and eternal activities and competitions.  However, the learning motivation of the participants was high and they showed great capability in understanding Physics concepts. The overall in-class performance was good.  According to the positive feedback from the subject teachers, tutors and students, it is recommended to re-run this workshop again in the coming school year.
