<p>1. “Train Your Brain” English workshop</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 16 classes of “Train Your Brain” English workshop were held during September 2023 and August 2024. 106 lessons were conducted in total. - The programme content included training on brainstorming ideas, skills building on understanding and analyzing questions, and practices on tackling questions. - Altogether 203 highly motivated learners of English from S.4 to S.6 attended. - Expenditure: \$77,269.5 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The overall percentage of attendance among students was fair with an overall attendance of 76.33%. - Students were satisfied with the programme. Responses to the post-workshop survey are as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ 85.63% of the students agreed that the workshops helped them develop their ability to understand and analyze questions. ■ 85.3% of the students agreed that their skills in tackling questions were developed. ■ 86.17% of the students agreed that the feedback from tutors was useful. ■ 81.5% of the students were satisfied with the workshop. - According to the positive feedback from the subject teachers, tutors and students, it is recommended to re-run this workshop again in the coming school year.
<p>2. “Excel to Excellence” Science workshop</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 2 classes of “Excel to Excellence” Science workshop were held. 14 lessons were conducted in total. - The programme content included training on logical thinking, skills building on participating in inter-school competitions, and enhancing knowledge in Science. - Altogether 26 highly motivated learners of Science from S.5 to S.6 attended. - Expenditure: \$5,239.5 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The overall percentage of attendance among students was not satisfactory with only 65% and 70% of attendance. Students’ attendance was severely affected by time clashes with other enhancement courses, and external activities and competitions. - However, the learning motivation of the participants was high, and they showed great capability in understanding Science concepts. The overall in-class performance was encouraging. - According to the positive feedback from the subject teachers, tutors and students, it is recommended to re-run this workshop again in the coming school year.
<p>3. “Excel to Excellence” Humanities workshop</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 1 class of “Excel to Excellence” Humanities workshop was held. 12 lessons were conducted in total. - The programme content included training on brainstorming ideas, skills building on understanding and analyzing questions, practices on tackling questions, and enhancing knowledge in Humanities. - Altogether 13 highly motivated learners of Humanities from S.5 to S.6 attended. - Expenditure: \$14,064.0 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The overall percentage of attendance among students was good with an overall attendance of 87.2%. - Students highly appreciated the programme and commented that the tutor performed brilliantly in enhancing their knowledge and horizons. - According to the positive feedback from the subject teacher, tutor and students, it is recommended to re-run this workshop again in the coming school year.
